

Dr Justine Rogers Deputy Director, FLIP Stream UNSW Law

Dr Justine Rogers is the Deputy Director of the NSW Law Society's Future of Law and Innovation (FLIP) research stream at UNSW Law. She is also a Senior Lecturer, teaching the core professional ethics course and a strand of jurisprudence (theories of law and justice).

From 2013-2018, Justine was a chief investigator in an Australian Research Council Linkage grant with the Professional Standards Councils on 'professionalism' and 'professional regulation' in the 21st Century. Her recently published articles cover such themes as the role of associations in professional regulation, and the ethics of AI in professional practice. Justine completed her DPhil at the Centre for Socio-Legal Studies at the University of Oxford, which was an ethnographic study of London barristers and pupillage.
