Associate Professor Matthew Gullo is a clinical psychologist and Medical Research Future Fund (MRFF) Translating Research into Practice (TRIP) Principal Research Fellow at the National Centre for Youth Substance Use Research, The University of Queensland. Matthew's research seeks to improve the assessment and treatment of substance use disorder through a better understanding of the complex biosocial cognitive mechanisms involved, revealing new targets for personalised intervention. Matthew led the Psychosocial

Interventions section of the <u>National Guidelines for the Treatment of Alcohol Problems</u>. He has authored 100 peer-reviewed scientific publications and been awarded over \$5M in research funding. A true scientist-practitioner, he continues to provide treatment services as a Visiting Senior Clinical Psychologist at the Princess Alexandra Hospital's Alcohol and Drug Assessment Unit. Here, he has led several innovations in service delivery that have benefited over 8,500 patients through translation of the latest research findings into improved clinical practice.

Matthew is a Member of the Australian Psychological Society (APS) and a Fellow of the APS College of Clinical Psychologists.
